The Jonathan Heintzelman Service Award

The Jonathan Heintzelman Service Award is presented to a person who is recognized for providing extraordinary services on behalf of the Chicago Council on Planned Giving (CCPG). The award was named in 2010 in honor of Jon Heintzelman who was the first President of CCPG when it was formed in 1980. Jon, who is a graduate of North Park University and Northwestern University School of Law, was Director of Planned Giving at Northwestern University for over two decades, then became Acting Vice President of Development at Northwestern before being named Senior Vice President for Advancement at Loyola University Chicago. He joined Ter Molen Watkins & Brandt as Chairman in 2013.

He has served on the Board of Trustees of North Park. He also has served as a board member of the American Council on Gift Annuities, as a member of the editorial board of the Journal on Gift Planning, and as a mentor for the United Negro College Fund. In 1993, Jon was named National Planned Giving Professional of the Year by Planned Giving Today and in 2004 he was awarded the AFP Chicago Chapter's Benjamin Franklin Award.

In addition to running outstandingly successful programs at Northwestern and Loyola, Jon has contributed his talents to CCPG for many decades as a leader in the planned giving profession and as a frequent presenter of many luncheon and symposium programs. He is considered a true leader among development and planned giving professionals.
