



Garry Sloan is the Director of Individual Philanthropy for Lake Forest Academy and has been with the school since January 2016. In his role, Sloan is responsible for cultivating and soliciting major gift and planned giving commitments in support of institutional priorities with an emphasis on endowment fundraising. He also manages the marketing of the school's gift planning program.

Prior to coming to LFA, Sloan was Director of Major Gifts – Midwest Region for the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. The Foundation supports and operates Colonial Williamsburg, the fully restored colonial capital of Virginia and the world's largest living history museum.

Sloan began his advancement career as Director of Administration and Development for The Congressional Chorus in Washington, DC. He helped establish their educational program, The American Youth Chorus, which provides musical training and performance opportunities for middle and high school students throughout the nation's capital.

Originally from Missouri, Sloan attended the University of Missouri – Columbia, followed by graduate work at the University of Central Oklahoma and the University of Oklahoma. He holds degrees in music education, conducting, and vocal music performance. Prior to his work in advancement, Sloan was an operatic and oratorio performer, vocal and choral music instructor, and a church musician.
